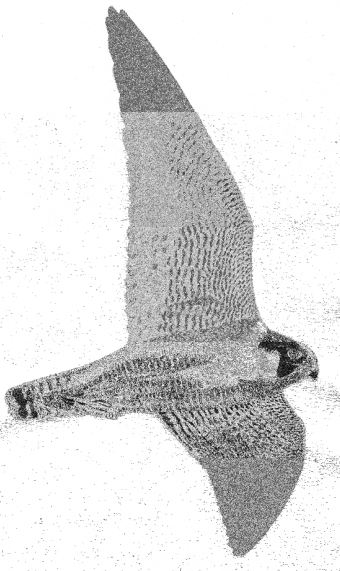

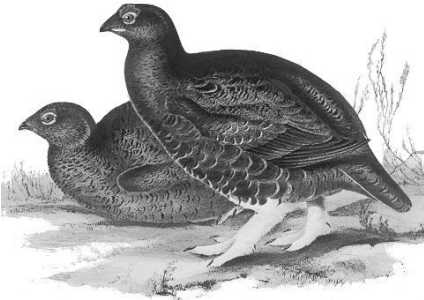

Bird Events

Grouse Hike

10 a.m. Saturday 24 March



The Red Grouse is an iconic bird of heather moorland. Sadly, its numbers are declining. Join us on this slow hike of 4 to 5 hours across open mountain, where we will discuss the ecology and management of the species. If we are lucky we may also see some grouse, but sightings cannot be guaranteed.

Location: We shall be meeting opposite Ballinastoe Golf Club near Roundwood. Participants will need their own transport to get there.

Practicalities: This hike is for adults only. Please bring a packed lunch and be equipped for hiking in bad weather—hiking boots & rain gear are essential. No dogs please. This event is free of charge.

Falcon Watch

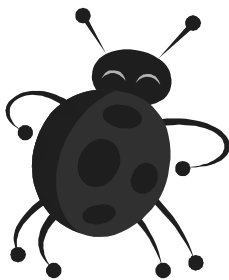

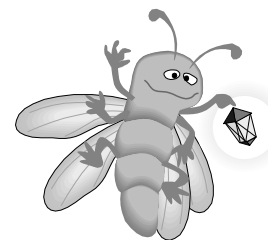
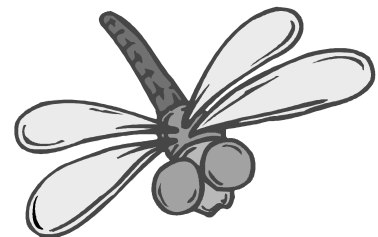

Bumblebee Workshop

At least a third of Ireland's 18 bumblebee species are threatened with extinction. Join us to learn about them and how to identify them. The workshop consists of a lecture inside followed by an identification walk.

Butterfly Workshop

Did you know that Ireland has 33 species of butterfly? Unlike many of our invertebrate species, butterflies are easy to identify and with a little bit of

effort, anyone can become competent at telling their Peacocks from their Tortoiseshells. This workshop shall start with a lecture to learn about Ireland's butterflies, and shall be followed by a walk to net and examine the butterflies in the field.

Wicklow is home to a large population of wild deer. They are particularly impressive in autumn when they 'rut'. National Park staff shall have telescopes set up on the Spinc walking trail between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. Anyone walking on this route is welcome to stop by, view the deer through the telescopes and discuss the deer and their ecology with our staff.



Location: The Spinc walking trail (white arrows), Glendalough. Participants are advised to visit to the Information Office (Upper Lake, Glendalough) to get directions to the telescopes before setting out.

Practicalities: The Spinc trail takes 3 hours. All are welcome, although the hike may be too long for young children. Please note, that participants will not be escorted on the hike. Hiking boots and rain gear are recommended. Bring binoculars if you have them. All dogs must be kept on leads. This event is free of charge, but please be aware that the Upper Lake car park (Wicklow Co. Co.) has a €4 charge.

Location: The Wicklow Gap. Park in either the Wicklow Gap car park or the Turlough Hill car park.

Practicalities: All welcome, but please leave your dogs at home. Participants are welcome to drop by any time between 11a.m. and 4p.m. and to stay as long or as short as you wish. The area is quite exposed, so please wear warm clothes. Wellies or hiking boots are recommended. This event is free of charge.

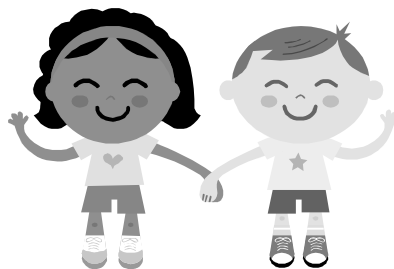

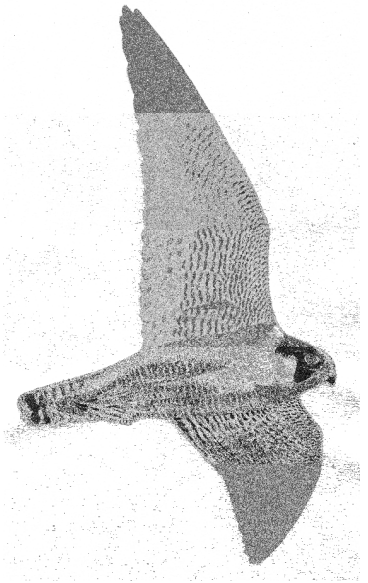
