

IN MY GARDEN - DANDELIONS

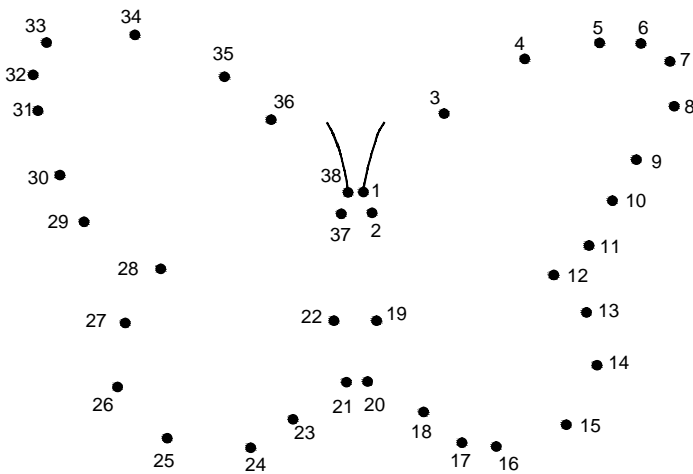


Dandelions are one of the first flowers to bloom in the Spring.

They are an important early source of nectar and pollen (food) for insects that hibernate over the winter, especially our Queen bumblebees, small tortoiseshell butterflies and other insect pollinators that are newly emerged in the Spring.

The dandelion flower opens in the morning to greet the sun and the insect pollinators and closes up at night.
