

Ivy is a common climbing plant. All plants need water, food and sunlight to survive. The more of these they can get the better they will grow.

Climbers use other things like trees, walls or buildings, to grow higher and get more sunlight. Climbers do not have woody stems and need support to get to the sunlight they need.

Ivy can provide homes for many animals. Birds can build nests in it. Bats can roost there overnight. Many different types of insects live in it.

When Ivy flowers in the Autumn it is a source of pollen and nectar for bumblebees when there are few other sources of food. It helps the Queen bees to prepare for their winter hibernation. The berries also provide food for birds during the winter.

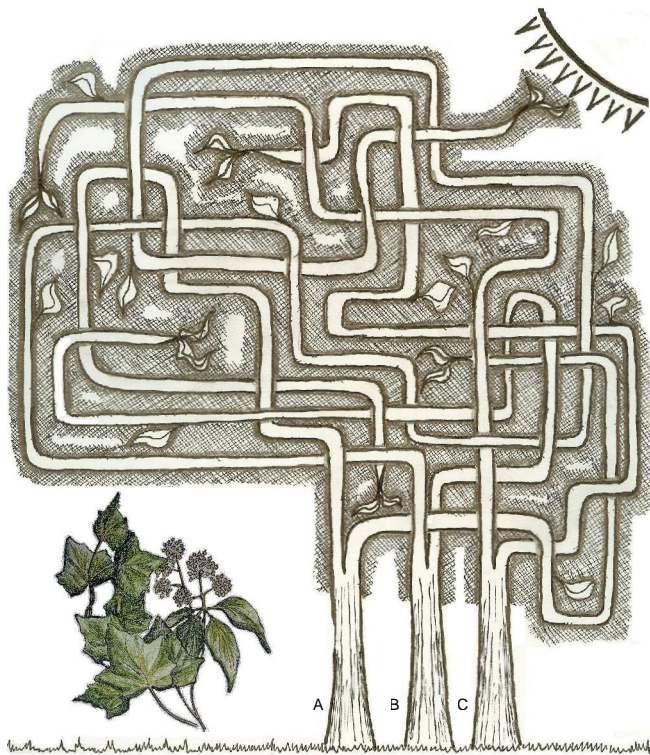
