


## IN MY GARDEN - LADYBIRDS



Ladybirds are a very popular garden insect. In Ireland we have 20 types (species) of ladybird. A ladybird is a beetle. They mostly eat aphids like greenfly which makes them the gardener's best friend.

Insects come in all shapes and sizes and they all have certain things in common. All insects have 3 main body parts and 6 legs. Bees, butterflies, ants and ladybirds are some of our best known insects.

Most insects go through a process called metamorphosis where the young insect (larva) completely changes in order to become an adult. Ladybirds go through this process and the larva is very different to the adult. Ladybird larvae have big appetites and mostly eat aphids as well.




Why not colour it in!
